SPRING BULK CLEAN-UP WEEK MAY 22-26TH

If you do not have regular weekly trash service or purchase trash tags, you will *NOT* be able to participate the in the clean-up day. SPRING CLEANING

It is that time of year again to start spring cleaning and with that in mind it is worth considering reducing cleaning products that we use daily that include hazardous ingredients, a few examples include:

Glass Cleaner	Mix one tablespoon of vinegar or lemon juice in one quart of water. Spray on and use newspaper to dry.
Furniture Polish	Mix one tablespoon of lemon juice in one pint of mineral or vegetable oil and wipe furniture.
Mothballs	Use cedar chips, lavender flowers, rosemary, mints or white peppercorns.


Township meetings are held the first Wednesday of every month beginning at 7:00 p.m. in the Township office.
