# PUMPKIN PAINTING DAYS: 10/9-12 @ LIBRARY HOURS






# MARKETING THE PRESIDENCY PRESENTATION: 10/24 @ 5 PM

### NONFICTION BOOK DISCUSSION-HIDDEN FIGURES: 10/30 @ 6 PM






known as "human computers" used pencils, slide rules and adding machines to calculate the numbers that would launch rockets, and astronauts, into space.

It chronicles their careers over nearly three decades they faced challenges, forged alliances and used their intellect to change their own lives, and their country's future.
