

DELAWARE TOWNSHIP

ORDINANCE #1

An ordinance of the Township Supervisors of Delaware Township, Mercer County, Pennsylvania, prohibiting the canvassing or soliciting of goods, wares, and merchandise within said Township by hawkers, peddlers, solicitors, itinerant merchants or transient vendors, not having been requested or invited to do so by the owner or owners, occupant or occupants of private residences, and prescribing penalties for violation.

SECTION 1

The practice of going in and upon private residences in the Township of Delaware by solicitors, peddlers, hawkers, itinerant merchants or transient vendors of merchandise not having been requested or invited to do so by the owner or owners, occupant or occupants of said private residences, for the purpose of soliciting orders for sale of goods, wares, and merchandise and/or disposing of and/or peddling or hawking the same is hereby declared to be a nuisance and punishable as such.

SECTION 2

Any persons violating any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall upon conviction thereof before any Justice of the Peace, be fined not more than fifty (\$50.00) dollars and costs of prosecution and in default of payment of such fine and costs shall be sentenced to imprisonment for not more than thirty (30) days.
